Sometime later the Waihavara district held o Aundraising venture. In those carly days it was advertised as a "Basket Social" products from -1 were in aid of the Districts Hall. Socia The ladies attending the event would put togethin a basket containing enough food for a small group Men would check out the many baskets on hand an then would bid and buy the basket of their choice The austroneer at the event was Mr. Hile Sirboy, who later years was our Mongonni County Council Chairman fe centerd years. Tomy took special notice of the baskets and noticed that young Mary had also brought hers to join man many others quailable Tony took notice of many details of the appearance of Mary's Baskt and decided he would bid only on it. The auction under way, and finally Tony had he chance to bid on the one of his choice. Tony was not going to be outhid, there was no stopping until the queticieer stopped and called out this basket goods go's to Tony Kartavich. Prich as work : 1 \* His was the highest price paid at the cruction, but as Tony now looke back, but as a result you share to bestet with the sponsor our Mary. Much talk and smiles during the meal. Tony and Mary were soon engaged and then on 18d September 1950 Engaged Tony and Mary Married Tony and Mary Married. The rest is History.

Following marriage Tony and Mary went sharemilking at Rangiahua, a son Ivan was born at Kawakawa Hospital in 1951. 1952 the the couple come back north and purchased a farm at Waiharang, all in scrub and gumholes everywhere. It had no house so the couple bought Dr. Montagues house in Mangonui for removal and shifted it onto their farm, (price for removal from Its site at Mangonui, fransported to Waiharara and setting up at new site on farm - \$160 Pounds, any further work on house to be charged out at 35 shilling's per hour) (Builder Dave Taylor) In 1953 their second son Peter was boun. In 1965 a new house was built on the farm and some four years later Tony and Mary decided to sell up and moved to Kaitaia for work. Tony found work at the N.A.F. (Allied Farmers in Kai taight remained with them for 18 years, they spent a further 5 years working for ' Corpes' at their depot in Bank Street, before retiring Mary worked at the Arcade Pharmacy 400 19 years and then a further 9 years at Shadkleton's Pharmacy, before retireing det 70 years of age. In 1984 Tony and Mary built their final residence in Kaitaia, at 3 Okahy Road, ( across the road from the Kaitaia Hospital.) Vegars - Zyan 11

Tony Hatavich - Parents story. Sither Milo Kartavich 1889-1976, arrived in New Zealand in 1908, (He was born at Orah near Vrgorac in Dalmatia Following arrival here he spent many years on the northern gumfields working at several fields, In 1925, Mijo exchanged letters and photos with a young lady back in Dalmatia. Anka Marevic Boin 1899 agreed to come to New Zealand and arrived here in 1926. The following year 1927 they were married at ST. Portricks Cathedral in Anckland. They then come north and settled at Waiharang where Mijo had purchased a farm, They had two sons - Jack born 1928 and Tony born 1930. Mary Katavich Mihaljevich Parents Story. Father Peter Mihaljevich 1908-1976, was born in Ignane, a village on the Dulmation Coast. Refer arrived in New Zealand onaboard the SS. Moeraki on the 25th August 1925. Following arrival, set off up north and settled in at Lake Ohia, Peter became a gundigger, he also had short stints at work at working at Kartava, Wripapakauri and Anekland. But on each occasion he returned back to Larke Ohig. Indeed that was where Peter married a local young Lady named Barbarg Pribicevich in 1930. The reception was held at the Lake Ohia Hall, They went on to have tour children George b. 1930, Mary 6. 1931, Videt 10.1933 and Walter b. 1934. The eldest two George and Mary attended the local Werowero Native School for a year or two. In 1937 the family moved further north to Sweetwater were Peter continued with gundigging. The children now attended the Awanyi School. In 1943 Peter, Baubara and family took on a sharemilking contract at Awanui, landowner was George Fleming Publician at the township (1914-1958) - Conta

Mary Grand fathers Story. June George Pribicevich hake Ohia. Born 1876 in the small coastal village, Zaostrog Dalmatia. In 1899 Jure married Tomica Banovic, also born Zaostrog. A son Ivan John was born the same year. Three years later 1902 Jure decided to leave his village, and make a start to a new life for his family, so it was New Zealand he chose. Late 1902 he was a passenger on the ill fated Steamship "Elingamite". The ship was on a regular run from Sydney to Avekland, with 58 crew and 139 passengers aboard. Of those passengers, 10 were Dalmatians. On saturday afternoon on the 8th November 1902, the ship entered of haze which drastically reduced uisability - 9:00 am Sunday merning the haze thickened, closing visibility to just -two ship lengths, Creeping through the fog, They were on a course for disaster. If was not discovered until years later that the Three Rings Fslands were wrongly charted. The bow struck rocks off the West Island at 10.40am, Captain Atwood was left with no option but to give the order to abandon ship and it sunk in 20 minutes Jure was one of 111 passengers who survived, At an enguiry that followed the tragedy, Jure was the spokesman on behalf of the Dalmartians. total of 45 lives were lost from drowning or e-posure 28 passengers and 17 crew members. Following his arrival in New Zealand June Chene Known as George) began work as a gundigger. In 1908 George's wife Tomica and son John arrived here. George bought a farm at the top end of Pekeray Rd hake Ohia. He built his family agnall home and then set about developing the steep scrubband property. The couple had three more children born here plus John, who married twice - Mihaljevich then Blackmore. 2 Katieb. 1908 later married Iran Grubisa 3 Barbarab. 1910 narried Peter Hilly Milhallievich 4 George Junior b. 1912, died a young man in 1932.
